SAMPLE WAYS THAT PSALM 23 MIGHT GUIDE YOUR PRAYER TIME WITH JESUS:

"The LORD is my Shepherd, I have everything I need..."

Jesus, as I come into that conversation today, as I try and solve that problem, as I try to steward the resources of time and money today, I recognize, that I have everything I need, that I don't need to prove myself or make something happen on my own.

"He makes me lie down in green pastures, leads me beside still waters..."

Jesus, I don't need to feel anxious or afraid or worried about what is upcoming today, because you are leading me to a place of stillness and rest before you. Lead me to a place of quiet trust before you.

"He leads me in right paths for his name's sake..."

Jesus, as I consider the elements of my day, I need your wisdom - lead me in the right paths; help me to make the right decisions...not for my sake, but for your sake, so that the Kingdom of God might be further revealed.

"Though I walk through the valley of death I fear no evil. For you are with me..."

Jesus in the uncertainties before me, in the confusion and disorientation, may I be aware of your nearness. Where I can't see your hand, may I trust your heart.

"Surely goodness and mercy will follow me..."

Jesus, may I be continually grateful for your goodness all around me, may I not be distracted by the trouble in life and miss your gracious and merciful hand. You have not treated me as my sins deserved. Grant me mercy in that meeting, with that problem, in that relationship.
