- As you set aside time to listen for Jesus' voice, what might He be showing you about how your thoughts, feelings and beliefs about either yourself or a current circumstance you are engaged in differ from His?
- In what ways are you seeking to intentionally explore this with him? How could you put yourself in the 'pathway of the Spirit' to allow Jesus to help you discern your own heart?
- What do you think Jesus might be saying to you in this season about the pace and condition of your internal world?

PART ONE:

Read Luke 15:11-24 (story of the prodigal son).

In what ways do you identify with the prodigal? Review the following list of false identity statements with Jesus and invite Him to show you which of the following you have been believing about yourself.

- I am a mistake
- I am a burden
- I am stupid
- I am worthless
- I am not allowed to make mistakes
- I must be approved by certain people to be ok
- I don't have the right to experience joy or pleasure
- I don't have the right to assert myself and say what I think and feel
- I don't have a right to feel
- I am valued based on my intelligence, physical appearance, wealth, and what I do, not who I am.

Now review the following list of **true identity** statements. Where does Jesus want to speak truth over you in place of the lies you've believed?

PART TWO:

Read Luke 15:25-32 (story of the older brother)

Listening Prayer:

Engage the same listening prayer exercise as above. Ask Jesus to show you what lies the older brother believed about himself, his identity in the family, and where he believed his value and worth was found (ie. False identity statements).

Listening Prayer:

Ask Jesus to show you if and where you have operated from the same or similar thoughts, feelings, beliefs about yourself.

Listening Prayer:

Ask Jesus to again review with you any place where He wants to speak truth over you in place of the lies you've believed.

Confession:

Confess and renounce the lies you've believed about yourself and pray for Jesus to show you what is true about your heart from His perspective.

Thanksgiving:

Spend time giving thanks to Jesus for all that He is revealing to you about your true identity in Him!
